- Teaching classes as well as advising students (4 academic hours weekly) in *Public Finance and related topics* in the German and English languages.
- Writing research papers suitable for publication in the relevant journals.
- Collaboration on research projects and publications in the chosen research area.
- Support in administrative tasks both in research and teaching.
