Candidates must have experience in current quantitative statistical methods.

In addition, we expect the candidate to be actively involved in the development of national and international collaborative activities within the university. He or she must be willing to cooperate across disciplines and to continuously advance the Center for Research on Education and School Development.

The candidate will teach classes and give lectures for the faculty's degree courses as appropriate and will be
